

50/50 Draw for Our Next Show

Inlaws Outlaws and other People(that should be shot) the second show of our 2017-18 season starts Friday night Feb. 2nd at 8 pm and runs for a total of 8 shows over the next two weekends.

To help raise funds, we run a 50/50 Draw. We do this at every one of the scheduled performances for the full run of the show.

For those unfamiliar with how the 50/50 draw works, we have volunteers show up about an hour before show time and sell numbered tickets to patrons as they arrive for a predetermined fee in the lobby. 3 for \$5.00 and 10 for \$10.00

At intermission, the monies collected from the ticket sales are totalled then split in half. A ticket is then drawn from all the ones sold and the winner walks away with half the pot. To keep the government happy, we record the winners name and phone number for our records.

We will have a board member at each performance so any questions or concerns can be directed to them.

We need TWO people per show if possible.

So if you can help out by taking a turn at selling tickets before the show and at the start of intermission, please email Maggie Parent at maggie66@rogers.com.

Be sure to include the date and time that you are able to help out. I need your response before the Friday of each weekend.



ECT's 2018-2019 Season

We are looking for directors to submit plays for consideration for next season. In the past we have done well with family oriented large cast shows, shows with familiar titles, classics, or award winning plays.



The dates, which include the move into theatre dates are:

Shakespeare in the Park – July 6, 7, 8, and 13, 14, 15, 2018.

Dec. 2 – 16, 2018. Feb. 10 – 24, 2019. Apr. 28 – May 12, 2019.

Potential directors should include a copy of the play, their resume plus the following information with their submission:

- info on the rights, and the royalties
- a synopsis of the play and the number in the cast
- any special production challenges (please note that we have a set design and build crew in place)
- the crew they have selected if known, or whether the director needs help forming a crew



Look no further—Theatre Ontario Summer Theatre Intensive is coming back to Stratford and will take place August 5th to 10th, and August 12th to 17th. After an outstanding 2 weeks last summer at Factory163 we have decided to return for a second year in a row. Sharing the building with artists, photographers, creators, and our friends over at Off The Wall, Stratford Artists' Alliance makes for an electric, creative atmosphere and we can't wait to get back in studio with this year's participants!

This year we are exploring offering classes in:

- 1. Beginner Directing
- 2. Dialogue Series Directors and Designers
- 3. Beginner Acting Monologues
- 4. Advanced Acting Scene Study
- 5. Teaching Acting
- 6. Creators' Lab
- 7. Voice Bootcamp
- 8. Stage Combat

Theatre Ontario's Summer Theatre Intensive brings together theatre people from all over the province for a week-long rigorous educational experience. For nearly forty years, our courses have earned praise from drama teachers, theatre schools, community and professional theatres, agents, and actors getting started in the business.

Have a look at the schedule on the *next page* which lists shows, many of them not too far from here, which will be adjudicated in the next few weeks. Maybe you will get a chance to go to see some of them. Five of these shows which have chosen to be entered 'IN' festival will be selected to take their show to Sarnia this year to be presented during the March Break along with the other four selections. Some of you will remember that ECT chose to be an 'OUT' of festival entry in WODL this year, which means we had an adjudication after our show and are eligible for awards and nominations. As you can see from the following chart, the adjudicator will be presenting her decisions on the Sunday, February 18th in Sarnia.

A play of hope and resilience about seniors whose lives have been impacted by mental health challenges including suicide

Playwright and Producer: Catherine Frid

Characters required: 2 men and 2 women, all in their 70s **Audition dates**: January 25 and 26, 1:30 – 3:30 pm

Rehearsals will be daytimes, 3 times weekly, for 3 hours each. Rehearsals start the week of February 19 will be

held until March 19, in Guelph.

Shows will be during the day, with touring dates in Wellington and Dufferin counties, from March 20 through

early May. Estimated 5 - 7 shows in this tour.

Compensation: This is a non-Equity production; actors will be paid honoraria.

After Whys was commissioned by the Suicide Awareness Council of Wellington-Dufferin, which is organizing this tour.

Catherine Frid's plays have been presented in Canada and the United States, including Guelph-area productions of *Dead Cat Bounce* and community co-creations *Our Voices: Seniors Selfies* and *Canada's Seniors: Our Roots, Our Future.* She has been artist in residence at Osgoode Hall Law School and at Mixed Company Theatre. Valerie Senyk is a Guelph-based director, actor, voice coach, and published author of poetry and journalism.
