

What a perfect activity to start off your summer! Opening July 6th!






Anne of Green Gables has been cast!

Pat's Sculpture by local artist and long-time active ECT member and past president: Beverley Cairns



The Elora Community Theatre Board of Directors celebrated the arrival of Pat Chataway in her new home at the Elora Information Centre at this past June Board meeting.

Honoured as Elora's Citizen of the Year in 1992, Pat Chataway was the founder and first President of the Elora Community Theatre in 1972 and founder of the Elora Children's' Drama Club in 1975.

For many years Pat was an advocate for the preservation of the Grand Theatre in Fergus and for it to be recognized as a performing arts venue in our community.

Pat was often seen at local sites in the late 1980s selling chocolate almonds to raise money to purchase the building. She was wildly happy when in 1990; Hugh and Lorraine Drewbrook purchased the building and began restorations on this community treasure.

The Fergus Grand Theatre is now proudly owned and operated by the Township of Centre Wellington for the benefit of all residents and visitors.
