

ships out at sea. He visits the moneylender Shylock to acquire the necessary funds. Shylock dislikes Antonio, but he agrees to lend Antonio the money on the condition that if he defaults on the loan, Shylock is entitled to a pound of Antonio's flesh. Ultimately, Shylock can't collect on his end of the deal because of the harm that would be done to Antonio, and Bassanio marries Portia.

We have heard your concerns about our current electronic communications and we ask that you bear with us as we address the issue. Always a challenge when we are all volunteers.



BRITTNEY – 22. The younger sister. Pretty. A Hooters Girl. Peppy, ditzy, sincere, genuine, not sarcastic.

TRISH - 45. Pretty. A nurse. Kind.

KEVIN – 30. Neighbor growing up. Good looking, successful business person, jock in high school.

MRS. NORQUIST (Voiceover) - 70's. Neighbor. A little loopy. We never see her. (Voiceover, can double cast - or if you would like, you can show her)


Little House on the Prairie the Musical
