
Alternative Production by Video - 2021 Line



Elora Community Theatre's next virtual performance will be a Youth prodution of War of the Worlds, directed by one of ECT's talented youth, Teagan Hiller.



If you are interested in auditioning for War of the Worlds, please pick one of the four monologues listed on the next two pages. Gender of character in monologue does not matter, just pick the one that stands out the most to you. Record yourself performing it following the steps below:

1) Make sure you can be seen waist up

2) Set your monologue on a music stand or tape it to the wall so your hands are free to move around

3) Introduce yourself, your age and what monologue you will be doing (also please say if there is a specific character or characters you are interested in)

4) Have Fun! We want to see you having fun and trying your best

Option 1: Artichoke By Joanna Mclelland Glass

(Lily Agnes has been told her Grandfather will be living with her for the entire summer and He'll be rooming with her)

"A young girl's room is a very private place. It's where I keep my personal belongings. It's where I have my private thoughts. And even though we're not religious here, my room is, for me, almost like a chapel. Grandpa and I adore each other-but that doesn't mean we could share room. Nearly every night I sing myself to sleep. And it was Grandpa who said, "Lily, you have a very interesting voice, but it is-untrained". And you must remember that Grandpa snores and sometimes smells medicinal. In my old book of Emily Post she says nothing must be spared the guest. She says he should have a good mattress and both a soft and firm pillow. He should have a brand new cake of soap, mouthwash and a good clothes' brush. He should have a light at the head of his bead and two or three books should be provided. These books should be chosen more to divert them than to strain the reader's attention. He should have an ashtray, a calendar, and a clock that works. Those things require a generosity of self. I could manage them, with grace, for two or three days. I could manage them with a chip on my shoulder for a week. I can't manage them at all for the whole summer. (pause) if there is any way to prevent it, I'd rather not leave my room."

Option 2: 7 Stories By Morris Panych

(A Man on the edge witnesses his neighbor using a fishing rod and a wad of cash to play God)

"Well Since you asked about the money I'll tell you, there's a man here just below us, on the sixth floor... Last night he turned to God for help!He's in a great deal of trouble, he drinks quite heavily... you see his wife left him three years ago and then he lost his job he was a carpet wholesaler... or carp-fish processor, I'm not really sure, he slurs his words quite a bit, Last year his son was killed on a motorbike ... or murdered with a knife, and six months ago a close friend of his was killed in what sounds like a freak accident involving either a stray piece of glass ... or the spraying of some gas..or a suspension bridge collapse! And now they're evicting him. He's asked for money and God is answering! Could the evidence be any clearer?"

Option 3: Eat Your Heart Out by Nick Hall

(A New York waiter dreams of being a broadway star)

"If there's one thing I can't stand in the theatre, it's walking out alone on stage at the beginning of the evening to open a show cold. But it's better than waiting tables. I'm Charlie, ... your waiter for this evening. I'd rather be on stage tonight. Waiting tables is a toy job. You probably don't know what a toy job is. I'll explain. A toy job is a job that you don't really care about, that you do to make a living, while you wait for the chance to do the job you want to do.But maybe you know already. Being a waiter is sort of a standard job for an actor; it's expected. I mean, if you're a dentist or an insurance salesman and someone says "where're ya' workin' nowadays?" and you say, "I'm a waiter at this little French place on fiftysixth street" they think you're a failure. But if you're an actor, they understand. So. (gesture to sign behind) Ici, personne ne parle français. That's the name of the place. Yeah I didn't get it the first time either. It means no one here speaks French."

Option 4: The Glass Menagerie By Tennessee Williams

(Tom Has Just stumbled home from a night out with friends at the theatre)

"There was a very long program. There was a Garbo picture and a Mickey Mouse and a travelogue and a newsreel and a preview of coming attractions. And there was an organ solo and a collection for the Milk Fund - simultaneously which ended up in a terrible fight between a lady and an usher! And, oh, I forgot! There was a big stage show! The headliner on this stage show was Malvolio the Magician. He performed wonderful tricks, many of them, such as pouring water back and forth between pitchers. First it turned to wine and then it turned to beer and then it turned to whiskey. I know it was whisky it finally turned into because he needed somebody to come up out of the audience to help him, and I came up- Both Shows! It was Kentucky Straight Bourbon. A very generous fellow, he gave me some souvenirs (he pulls a silk scarf from his pocket) He gave me this. This is his magic scarf. You can have it ,Laura. You wave it over a canary cage and you get a bowl of goldfish. You wave it over the goldfish bowl and they fly away canaries."
