Step 1: Please pitch us your idea by email to ectinformation@gmail.com and tell us your concept. Please apply, determine, and present royalties and streaming rights (if your show is chosen ECT will cover the costs).

Deadline for Step 1: December 12th, 2020

- **Step 2**: We will invite those shortlisted to meet with our committee by ZOOM to further discuss the idea!
- **Step 3:** We will put out an audition call on your behalf to our Membership, and via social media, and email
- **Step 4:** You can use our ZOOM platform for readthroughs and quick rehearsal
- **Step 5:** Through David Tanner we will arrange for the Production and editing
- **Step 6:** We upload and stream your final product!



Marketing Update by Deb Dalziel:

For all Productions that took place prior to Covid 19 outbreak the following marketing procedures were implemented. The financial out lay remained the same for all productions that took place at the Fergus Grand Theatre and the summer outdoor performance of Love Stories.

- Posters and Brochures were submitted to libraries, school boards in and around Centre Wellington, County of Wellington and certain areas covered off by members outside of CW in the waterloo/Kitchener region.
- Posters shared in soft copy to all regional Theatre Clubs and Organizations
- New for 2019, a regular campaign was set up for 101.1 the Grand. The radio campaigns provided a \$200.00 buy of ads for each show running. *Note- Radio was not done for outdoor performances as these shows are by donation only.
- As part of our radio buy, PSA and ticket giveaways were made available for each show. 10 pairs of tix were made available for giveaway on morning show daily Monday to Friday.
- Arranged for digital or hard copy of Posters to be available at Fergus Grand Theatre
- Creative materials was part of the services offered by RR
 Printing. All poster and program design was created with Lisa
 of RR Printing and Deb Stanson.
- A frame signs were located at Elora post office and lawn signs distributed.
- Press releases were created and distributed to a media list of 20 outlets regionally.
- Marketing Team created Story board at all productions to promote cast, crew, sponsors and special thank you's.

Social Media Update by Amie Butchart:

Instagram Account: Only opened it in the fall of 2019 and have 339 followers thus far. Members include some other businesses and organizations in Center Wellington including; Elora BIA, The Observer, The Wellington Advertiser, The Grand 101, and several other influencers in the area.

Facebook Account: Elora Community Theatre currently has a private Facebook page where only the Admins can post, which has 262 followers. Here only ECT related news and events gets posted for our members to enjoy. ECT also has a public group called "Backstage with Elora Community Theatre", where members or other theatre groups etc. can post events and information. We have 613 members on our public group and all things shared on our private page are also distributed to this large group. Additionally , ECT has done a couple of sponsored Facebook ads for some of our shows:

- Mom's Gifts Ad reached 6853 people and 182. Targeted at Center Wellington and Guelph.
- Yes Virginia Ad reached 3700 and had 192 clicks.

Board of director member's Deb Dalziel and Amie Butchart attended the Digital Excellence seminar hosted by the Township and Tourism Innovation this past year. They received some great feedback about our online presence, what we were doing well and where to improve. We have since implemented many new things and our online presence is strongly growing.

had to be cancelled and/or postponed, since no live theatre could be performed. However, the directors of the 2020/2021 line-up took to ECT's virtual playhouse to read/perform their plays virtually (except for "Stuart Little"). If circumstances permit, the new season will be carried over to the 2021-2022 season along with "Little House on the Prairie".

Website Update by Jennifer Roeder:

This past year a new website was developed for ECT to be used for promotional purposes. After looking into different software programs, ECT decided to purchase a membership with Weebly – a easy to use "drop and drag" web design platform. Our original URL (www.eloracommunitytheatre.com) was kept and transferred to this new site allowing ECT to post information on their current shows, auditions and newsletters. The newly designed site has been operating with great success, having even received a phone call from a school in the GTA asking to book a large group of tickets for Little House after seeing the advertisements online. 32 people have also signed up to receive ECT's monthly newsletter via the new website.

Although our new site is up and running there is still lots of work to be done. ECT has started to build a gallery to post information and pictures of their past shows, but reached a stand still with the lack of shared files of past performance bills, posters, etc. In the coming year, the board would like to configure a common drive where all ECT press releases, pictures, playbills, posters and cast lists can be stored for easy access. This information can be used to aid in our website gallery, as well as our social media posts, and as a data pool for future newsletter articles.
